Scarlet Fever and Chicken Pox

We have a couple of cases of Scarlet Fever in school. The first symptoms often include a sore throat, headache, fever, nausea and vomiting. After 12 to 48 hours the characteristic fine red rash develops (if you touch it, it usually feels like sandpaper). Scarlet Fever usually clears up after a week, but it is advisable to visit your GP to get a full diagnosis and proper treatment, which includes a treatment of antibiotics for 24 hours before returning to school.
