- Volunteers come in and listen to your child read
- We teach them reading skills in their literacy lessons
- We read stories to them
- We give them prizes for reading!



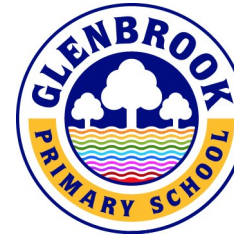
What should my child read?

- Books from school or books from home
- Their own favourite books.
- Reading Eggs on the internet
- Bug Club on the internet
- Magazines
- Information books

How often should I listen to my child read?

- Please listen to your child read every night for 10 minutes and sign their reading diary
- They get Bug Points for all of the reading they do. With these points, they can buy prizes!

Helping your child to read

How you can help your child with their reading

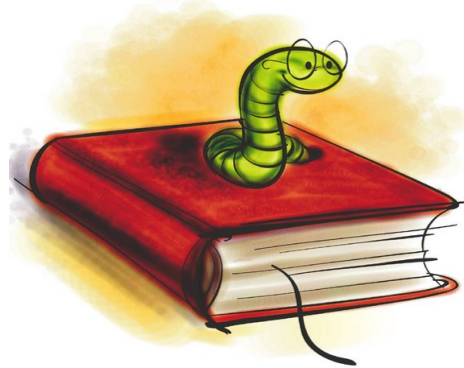
- Continue to read to your child frequently using a range of books
- Take it in turns to read when sharing books with your child
- Reinforce strategies taught at school by using:
 - picture clues
 - sounding out letters in words
 - recognising common words
 - working out what new words might be from the context of the sentence
 - reading on and coming back to tricky words

Questions to ask your child

Some of other things you can talk

about with your child are:

- The sort of book they are reading
- If they enjoyed the book
- Did they like the pictures?
- What might happen next?
- Have they read anything similar before?
